An Encouraging Word For This "Kairos" Moment

Let this be "your" Kairos moment!

What is Kairos?

In Christian theology

In the New Testament Kairos means "the appointed time in the purpose of God", the time when God acts (e.g. Mark 1.15, the kairos is fulfilled). Mark 1:15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

Kairos (used approximately 81 times in the NT) seems to be an indeterminate time, a "moment" or a "season," whereas another Greek term chronos (used 54 times) refers to a specific amount of time, such as a day or an hour (Acts 13.18, 27.9, etc.).

Truths For Following God In Crucial Moments

Following God Means Venturing Into The Unknown

At crucial moments in our life we must TRUST God wholeheartedly! There is no other way to walk with God!

- 1. We must TRUST God in that God given moment, when we need to guide or counsel our sons and daughters. This is the moment when they will hear! God appoints a time for repentance and a time to reap! God always provides a way of escape when we sin or miss His Devine purpose!
- 2. We must TRUST God in that God given moment when we "must" make major business decisions! This is the moment when the impossible suddenly becomes possible! In that God given "set time" He gives you grace to succeed beyond your earthly power! In that Kairos moment, you are assisted by the Supernatural! The Holy Spirit brings wisdom and insight beyond your intellect to solve the problem or adjust the situation for success!
- 3. We must TRUST God for our health! Yes, God heals our sickness and infirmities when we pray, but in that Kairos moment, we suddenly feel a touch from the Devine hand of God! It is in that moment that sickness and disease must yield it sting to God's healing power! In that God given moment of supernatural faith we experience

- something beyond our earthly efforts in making our bodies well. It is a Devine appointed time of supernatural healing!
- 4. We must TRUST God to heal a failing relationship or to bring a Devine relationship into our life! God is always working in our best interest. Romans 8:28 "For we know all things work out to the good for those that love God, for those called according to His purpose." In that Kairos moment, we can suddenly see clearly! It's as if scales have fallen from our eyes and we can sense and see God's Devine will for our life and for the person/relationship in our life.

To walk with God in those Kairos moments is not meant to be a foolish guess or chance! It is to walk by FAITH, not by earthly sight but by the Spirit of the Lord!

Following God means venturing into the unknown at times

At crucial moments in his life, Abraham had to trust God with a completely unknown future. God told Abraham to "go" without telling him where he was headed. He told Abraham that he would have a son without explaining how. Later on, God would ask Abraham to sacrifice this son without explaining why.

Remember:

- 1. You are blessed to be a blessing.
- 2. To become a blessing we have to take our hands off everything and make God our priority, our trust, and make His kingdom our delight.
- 3. To become a blessing we have to believe in the God directed impossibilities to become possible!
- 4. To become a blessing we must discern and listen for those KAIROS moments that God drops into our life!

Listen for your Kairos moments in your life!
